THE

DETROIT MUSEUM OF ART

IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, FREE, EVERY DAY IN THE WEEK FROM NINE A. M. TO FOUR P. M., EXCEPT SUNDAYS, WHEN THE HOURS ARE FROM TWO TO FOUR P. M.

The Museum is also frequently open in the evening for Lectures and during special exhibitions.

On Sunday afternoons, during the winter, illustrated lectures are given on art, history and kindred topics.

Children under 15 years of age, unless accompanied by older people, are not admitted, except on Saturdays, which day is set apart for the pupils of the Public and Private Schools, though classes of young people in charge of teachers are welcome at all times, and when the Museum is notified in advance, arrangements are made to make such visits of special value and interest to the party.

Visitors desiring information in regard to pictures, statuary, artists or sculptors, or objects in any of the collections in the Museum, by applying at the office will receive every attention possible on the part of the Museum employes.

Every facility is afforded students who wish to sketch or copy any object in the Museum, except where the article is loaned, in which case a written permit from the owner must first be secured.
