of English descent, was born in Vermont. He was given the usual training of the schools and the academy of his native town of Thetford.

His one ambition being to work in art, and Vermont at that time furnishing no opportunity for education in that direction, he early made his way to Boston. Being obliged to earn his living while studying art, he took up the practice of engraving on wood as a means of support.

In this department of art he achieved such success as to bring him medals from the Paris Salon, the World's Columbian Exposition at Chicago, the Pan-American Exhibition at Buffalo, a special gold medal and diploma at Boston, and other awards both in America and Europe.

Some years ago Mr. Closson abandoned engraving in order to devote his whole time to painting. His work in this direction is now becoming well known in the cities of the East, having been shown in many of the large Exhibitions in Boston, New York, Philadelphia and Washington.

He is a member of the Boston Art Club, Boston Water Color Club, Copley Society, Society of Washington Artists, Allied Connecticut Academy of American Artists, American Institute of Graphic Arts, Union International des Beaux-Art et des Lettres.

He is represented in the William T. Evans collection in the National Gallery at Washington, D. C., Boston Museum of Fine Arts, Worcester Art Museum, New York Public Library, and in private homes and galleries in the East and West.
