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The three annual exhibitions previously held under the name of the Hopkin Club were arranged and directed largely by members of the Scarab Club, an organization for the promotion of the fine arts in Detroit, and the change in name indicates nothing more than the policy of the Scarab Club to broaden the exhibition and to include prizes generously donated by members of the Scarab Club and its friends.

Annual 1914 Exhibition

The annual exhibition of original works of art, under the management of the Scarab Club, of Detroit, will be held at the Detroit Museum of Art from November 17th to December 20th, 1914.

Michigan Artists

Michigan artists, including those living abroad, are eligible.

The exhibition will consist of oils, water colors, pastels, etchings, monoprints and sculpture.

Entry Cards due November 10 All works intended for the exhibition must be entered upon regular entry cards and these must reach the Detroit Museum of Art by November 10th. Additional entry cards may be obtained by writing to the Detroit Museum of Art.

Work received until Nov. 12 All works must be received at the Museum not later than Thursday, November 12th. Works from points outside of Detroit must be sent charges prepaid.

Jury

All works entered will be submitted to a competent jury and pictures accepted will be hung. No work of art previously exhibited in Detroit will be accepted.

Hanging Committee The arrangement and hanging of the exhibition will be left to the Hanging Committee and no accepted work can be withdrawn before the close of the exhibition.

Work Returned

Work which the jury does not find available must be called for not later than November 23d, upon receipt of notification of the jury's action.

Reception and Opening View

The reception and formal opening of the exhibition will be held Tuesday evening, November 17th, from 7:30 until 10 o'clock.

Sales

The Museum will forego all commissions on sales and the exhibitors are advised to enter a low but fixed price.

PRIZES

Scarab-Hopkin Prizes A Scarab-Hopkin first prize of \$50.00 and second prize of \$25.00 will be awarded for the best paintings in oil painted in 1914 by resident artists of Detroit. A Scarab-Hopkin first prize of \$35.00, and second prize of \$15.00 will be awarded for the best pieces of sculpture produced by resident artists of Detroit during 1914.

D. M. Ferry, Jr. Prize The D. M. Ferry, Jr. prize of \$50.00 will be awarded for the best landscape painting by a Michigan artist.

The Rolshoven Prizes Mr. Herman Rolshoven, of Detroit, has contributed \$50.00, to be awarded for the best painting of a figure, and Mr. Julius Rolshoven has further contributed \$25.00, to be awarded to the best painting of a head in oil. The Rolshoven competitions are open to Michigan artists.

Prizes

The Jere C. Hutchins first prize of \$15.00 and second prize of \$10.00 will be awarded for the best etchings of any subject, either in color or black and white. The competition is open to members of the Scarab Club.

Charles B. King Prize The Charles B. King prize of \$15.00 will be awarded for the best monoprint in color made in 1914. The competition is open to members of the Scarab Club.

Conditions

No work will receive more than one prize, although one artist may compete for any or all awards. The Juries of Award reserve the right to withhold any of the above prizes.
