BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Evdokin Bartoshuk was born in Russia on August 9, 1895. He married Anna Fedchina in 1928, and they had two daughters, Nina and Violet Bartoshuk.

Bartoshuk began work at Ford Motor Company in August, 1913, and attended the Henry Ford English School in 1919. In 1924 he became an apprentice, and moved through the company holding positions as a die maker and leader until his retirement from Ford Motor Company in 1962.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Evdokin Bartoshuk Papers, 1913-1958 (1.4 cubic ft.), contain charts, data and drawings related to Bartoshuk's tool making and machining activities at Ford Motor Company, primarily dating from the mid to late 1950s. Also included in the collection is Bartoshuk's Ford English School diploma from 1919, and a large, undated photographic studio portrait of Mr. Bartoshuk.
