BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Charles P. Steinmetz (1865-1923) was born in Germany and educated in Breslau, Berlin, and Zurich. He immigrated to the United States in 1889, joined General Electric as a consulting engineer in 1893. Steinmetz received an honorary A.M. from Harvard in 1902 and in 1903 earned a Ph.D. from Union University in New York where he served as professor of electrophysics. He was the author of numerous theoretical books and articles on electricity, mathematics, and experimental investigations. He patented over 100 inventions and improvements on generators and motors.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The items in this collection include letters in German written to his sister, Clara, one manuscript on motors, and 184 original patents.
